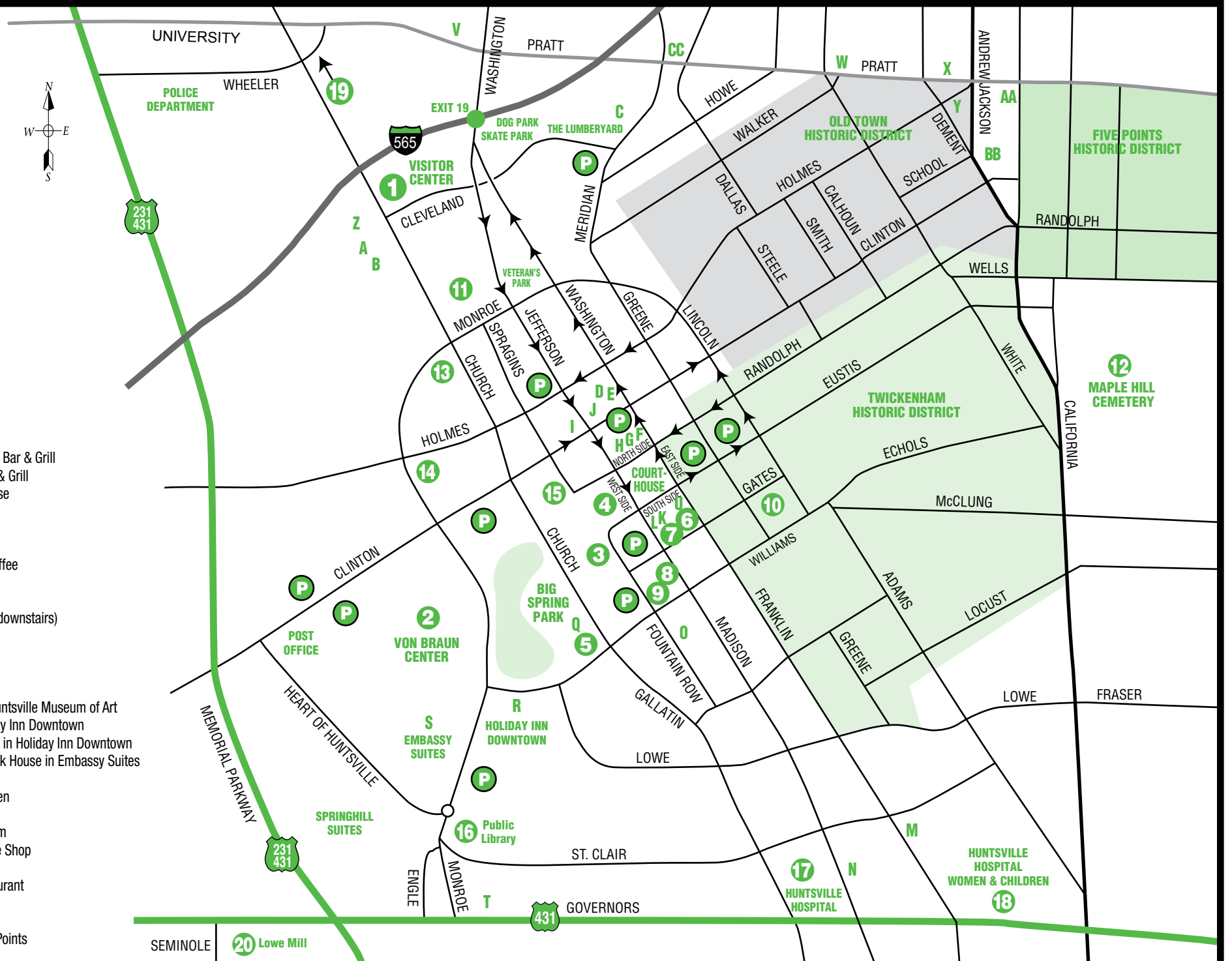

- 1 VISITOR CENTER** - For complete information on the area, visit the **Huntsville/Madison County Visitor Center**. Open every day except major holidays. 256-533-5723 • 500 Church Street • www.huntsville.org
- 2 VON BRAUN CENTER** – The center hosts hundreds of meetings, exhibitions and cultural performances each year. 256-533-1953 • 700 Monroe Street • www.vonbrauncenter.com
- 3 BIG SPRING INTERNATIONAL PARK** - The landscaped park bisected by waters from the Big Spring lies between the Von Braun Center and the Courthouse Square.
- 4 VISITOR INFO ON THE SQUARE** - Area information. Located in the original 1835 bank building. Open weekdays. 216 West Side Square.
- 5 HUNTSVILLE MUSEUM OF ART** - Galleries display pieces from the permanent collection as well as touring exhibitions. Visit the museum shop off the lobby. 256-535-4350 • 300 Church Street SW • www.hsvmuseum.org
- 6 HARRISON BROTHERS HARDWARE** - Established in 1879 and now owned by the non-profit Historic Huntsville Foundation. This is the state's oldest hardware store and popular gift and garden store. 256-536-3631 • 124 South Side Square • www.harrisonbrothershardware.com
- 7 ALABAMA CONSTITUTION VILLAGE** - The living-history village commemorates the writing of Alabama's first Constitution on this site. Costumed guides stroll through period rooms restored to early 19th-century atmosphere. 256-535-6564 • 109 Gates Avenue • www.earlyworks.com
- 8 EARLYWORKS CHILDREN'S MUSEUM** - This innovative, hands-on history experience features Alabama buildings, a storytelling tree and a talking clock. 256-564-8100 • 404 Madison Street • www.earlyworks.com
- 9 BICENTENNIAL PARK** - An interactive fountain for the young and young at heart to romp in, bench seating for observers, bronze statues, and a pavilion. 315 Fountain Circle
- 10 THE WEEDEN HOUSE** - Built in 1819, this is the oldest building in Alabama open to the public. For over a century, the Federal structure was home to the Weeden family, with the most notable resident being Maria Howard Weeden, a portrait artist. 256-536-7718 • 300 Gates Avenue • www.weedenhousemuseum.com
- 11 HISTORIC HUNTSVILLE DEPOT** - The three-story brick depot was built in 1860 as a passenger terminal and to house corporate offices of the Eastern Division of the Memphis & Charleston Railroad. During the Civil War, Union soldiers captured the depot in 1862. 256-535-6525 • 320 Church Street NW • www.earlyworks.com
- 12 MAPLE HILL CEMETERY** - Founded in 1818, Maple Hill is one of Alabama's oldest and most beautiful cemeteries and borders the Twickenham Historic District. The name connotes the scores of maple trees which each October color the "burial ground."

- 19 DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES - PUBLIC SAFETY** – 1115-A Church Street, 256-539-0681
- 20 LOWE MILL ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT** – Home to a diverse community of artists and businesses dedicated to the free expression of the arts. 2211 Seminole Drive • 256-533-0399 • www.lowemill.net

OLD TOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT - A Victorian neighborhood north of Randolph, Old Town also contains significant early 19th century Federal houses. Major streets are Clinton, Holmes, Steele, Smith, Calhoun, White, School, Dallas and Walker.

TWICKENHAM HISTORIC DISTRICT - Dozens of Federal homes dating from 1814 flank streets south and east of Harrison Brothers Hardware. Founder LeRoy Pope originally named the town Twickenham in honor of a suburb of London. Among the major streets are Franklin, Gates, Williams, Greene, Adams, McClung, Echols, Eustis, Locust, Lincoln and Randolph.

FIVE POINTS HISTORIC DISTRICT - The name of the town's first subdivision is derived from the intersections of Pratt, Andrew Jackson and Holmes. Homes date from the 1920's.
